FOR STARTERS

How would you define an idol?

Why is it that idols are so attractive and we all battle with them?

Remind yourself of the first commandment (Exodus 20:3) and what Jesus described as the greatest commandment (Mathew 22:36-37).



BACKGROUND

After hundreds of years of idolatry and immorality and warnings from God, judgment has finally fallen on Judah. The Babylonian armies attacked and destroyed the city of Jerusalem in 586 BC and many were taken into exile.

Into that 'hopeless' situation Isaiah brought a beautiful message from God:

- God hadn't given up on them forgiveness was available (40:1-11).
- God was the all powerful creator and would channel down his strength to weak people if they would trust him and hope in him (40:12-31).
- God was sending his servant to introduce a new covenant, bring light to the nations and put everything right (42:1-9).

<u>The big question</u>: would they trust in the living God in their present crisis? God's people throughout history have often found a division in their hearts. Often, we (like they) devote our energies, attention and affection to other gods. Isaiah 44 is a stinging attack on idolatry.
